PHẦN 1: 15 CHỦ ĐỀ IELTS SPEAKING PART 1 HAY GẶP

1. AI & Technology in Education: How often do you utilize AI tools in your studies?

"To be perfectly frank, generative AI platforms like ChatGPT and Claude have become an **indispensable asset** in my academic workflow. Rather than relying on them passively to do my work, I treat them as a **pedagogical sounding board** to brainstorm nuanced arguments and clarify intricate grammatical patterns."

Key Lexis: indispensable asset (tài sản không thể thiếu), sounding board (công cụ phản hồi ý tưởng), nuanced arguments (luận điểm đa chiều).

2. Accommodation: Do you live in a house or an apartment?

"Currently, I reside in a high-rise condominium in the heart of Da Nang. What I appreciate most is the **panoramic vista** of the Han River from my balcony and the state-of-the-art residential amenities, although the living room is a bit **compact in size**."

3. Hometown: What do you like most about your hometown?

4. Daily Routine: What is your favorite time of the day?

"I am unequivocally a **morning lark**. The dawn hours, roughly between 5:30 and 7:00 AM, are an invaluable window of solitude. The atmosphere is completely devoid of traffic noise, which allows me to **plunge into deep work** and meditate with uncompromised mental clarity."

13. Travelling: What kind of destinations do you prefer for vacations?

"I have an overwhelming preference for off-the-beaten-track rural landscapes rather than commercialized tourist traps. Immersing myself in indigenous customs and breathing unpolluted mountain air genuinely resets my psychological equilibrium."

PHẦN 2: 8 CUE CARDS IELTS SPEAKING PART 2 & BÀI NÓI BAND 8.0 TOÀN DIỆN**CUE CARD 1: Describe an impressive educational event or workshop you attended.**

You should say: When and where it happened; Who organized it; What activities took place; And explain why it left such a profound impression on you.

"I would like to talk about an interactive STEM & Experiential English Workshop titled 'Young Innovators' organized by EduCenter, which I had the privilege of attending approximately three months ago in Da Nang. The auditorium was teeming with over two hundred enthusiastic educators, curious young learners, and forward-thinking parents. What genuinely captured my admiration was the experiential science quadrant, where children were challenged to engineer clean water filtration prototypes entirely communicating in English. Instead of rote memorization, children engaged in tactile experimentation and delivered live pitches of their scientific discoveries. Witnessing youngsters articulate complex fluid dynamics with genuine poise was extraordinarily inspiring. It reinforced my conviction that language acquisition flourishes exponentially when coupled with hands-on inquiry."

CUE CARD 2: Describe a challenging project you successfully completed.

You should say: What the project was; Who you worked with; What difficulties you encountered; And explain how you felt after completing it.

"A particularly demanding endeavor that immediately springs to mind is the digital migration and curriculum overhaul project I spearheaded last semester. Our four-member collegiate team was tasked with digitizing over five hundred printed lesson plans into an interactive LMS platform within an extremely tight six-week deadline. The primary hurdle was navigating persistent software integration bugs and aligning divergent editorial opinions among team members. To overcome this bottlenecks, I instituted a daily 15-minute agile stand-up meeting and introduced transparent task allocation boards. When we finally deployed the polished curriculum ahead of schedule, the sense of collective jubilation was palpable. It not only honed my crisis management competencies but also validated the power of agile collaboration."

CUE CARD 3: Describe an environmentally friendly law or policy you support.

You should say: What the policy is; How you learned about it; Who is affected by it; And explain why you think this policy is beneficial.

"I want to highlight the stringent municipal ban on single-use non-biodegradable plastic packaging and straws recently enforced across coastal hospitality venues. I initially caught wind of this directive via a national environmental documentary. This mandate legally compels restaurants, resorts, and cafés to transition entirely to compostable bamboo, paper, or cassava-based alternatives. While it initially sparked minor resistance due to upfront procurement costs, its ecological dividends are indisputable. Over the past six months, coastal marine litter in my local area has plummeted noticeably. By disincentivizing disposable consumer culture through legislative teeth, this policy plays a pivotal role in shielding delicate marine ecosystems."

CUE CARD 4: Describe a person who has had a significant positive influence on your life.

You should say: Who this person is; How you know them; What qualities they possess; And explain how they influenced your perspective.

"Without a shadow of a doubt, the individual who has exerted the most transformative influence on my academic trajectory is my high school English mentor, Mr. Hoang. Beyond possessing encyclopedic mastery of linguistics, his most distinguishing hallmark was his relentless pedagogical empathy. During times when I was paralyzed by self-doubt and impostor syndrome, he patiently deconstructed my fear of public speaking by instilling the philosophy that errors are merely stepping stones toward proficiency. His exemplary work ethic and unwavering integrity taught me that true intellect must always be anchored in intellectual humility."

CUE CARD 5: Describe a historical monument or heritage site that fascinated you.

You should say: Where it is located; When you visited it; What historical significance it holds; And explain why it fascinated you.

"I would like to share my experience visiting the Imperial Citadel of Thang Long in Hanoi last autumn. Recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage site, this ancient political nerve center spans over a millennium of Vietnamese history. As I walked amidst the moss-covered brick ramparts and excavated archaeological foundations dating back to the Ly and Tran dynasties, I was overcome with profound historical reverence. What captivated me most was the subterranean military bunker utilized during the modern resistance era, juxtaposed against thousand-year-old stone dragon balustrades. It served as a visceral testament to our ancestors' indomitable resilience."

CUE CARD 6: Describe a piece of modern electronic equipment that you find indispensable.

You should say: What device it is; When and where you obtained it; What you use it for; And explain why life would be inconvenient without it.

"The gadget that has thoroughly embedded itself into the fabric of my daily routine is my noise-cancelling wireless headphones. I acquired them two years ago prior to entering university. Equipped with sophisticated acoustic algorithms, they instantaneously neutralize background hubbub, transforming chaotic coffee shops or roaring public transit into an oasis of serene contemplation. For someone whose academic productivity hinges heavily on uninterrupted focus during scholarly research, this device is not an opulent luxury, but rather an essential cognitive buffer against contemporary sensory overload."

CUE CARD 7: Describe an unforgettable road trip or journey you took in Vietnam.

Traversing the formidable Ma Pi Leng Pass—with towering limestone karst cliffs plunging thousands of meters down to the emerald Nho Que River—was an awe-inspiring sensory experience. At one juncture, our motorcycle suffered a punctured tire miles away from civilization, but local ethnic villagers warmly welcomed us into their stilt home, offering steaming corn tea while repairing the vehicle. The sublime grandeur of nature coupled with heartwarming human benevolence made that journey utterly unforgettable."

CUE CARD 8: Describe an inspiring speech or presentation you listened to.

You should say: Who the speaker was; Where you heard it; What core themes were discussed; And explain how it inspired you.

"I vividly recall attending a keynote address delivered by a prominent educational tech entrepreneur during an international EdTech summit hosted in Da Nang. The central premise of his discourse pivoted around democratizing premium education through open-source digital infrastructure. Rather than viewing artificial intelligence as an apocalyptic threat to human educators, he persuasively argued that automated systems liberate teachers from mundane grading, empowering them to become empathetic socio-emotional coaches. His rhetorical cadence, backed by rigorous empirical datasets, dismantled prevailing technophobic hysteria and ignited in me a fervent desire to leverage technology for educational equity."

Q2: What pedagogical skills will be most essential for 21st-century educators?

[Point]: Modern instructors must pivot from being sole repositories of facts to adept facilitators of critical inquiry and digital literacy. **[Explain]:** In an era where information is ubiquitous at the tap of a screen, memorization has diminished in utility. Instead, cultivating students' ability to discern verified truths from algorithmic bias and synthesize multidisciplinary knowledge is paramount. **[Link]:** Teachers who master cognitive coaching will remain irreplaceable.

Q3: How has the prevalence of remote working altered modern urban landscapes?

[Point]: The widespread institutionalization of telecommuting has initiated a noticeable decentralized demographic shift. **[Explain]:** Knowledge workers are no longer tethered to high-rent central business districts, prompting an exodus toward peripheral suburbs or regional coastal towns. **[Example]:** Cities like Da Nang have witnessed an influx of digital nomads seeking balanced lifestyles. **[Link]:** Consequently, municipal planners must recalibrate transport and commercial infrastructure to cater to polycentric urban growth.

Q4: Do economic penalties or public awareness campaigns prove more potent in curbing pollution?

[Point]: I contend that legislative deterrence paired with punitive fiscal mechanisms provides far swifter results than moral persuasion alone. **[Explain]:** While environmental workshops cultivate long-term ethical awareness, corporate behavior is inherently profit-driven. **[Example]:** Imposing steep carbon taxes and hefty fines on industrial polluters immediately alters operational cost-benefit calculations. **[Link]:** Therefore, robust legal enforcement must form the cornerstone of environmental governance.

Q5: Why is preserving indigenous intangible heritage crucial in an era of globalization?

[Point]: Safeguarding indigenous traditions is indispensable for maintaining cultural diversity and collective psychological anchor. **[Explain]:** Unbridled globalization often homogenizes regional languages, folktales, and artistic customs into a generic Westernized consumer monoculture. **[Example]:** Losing indigenous dialects means forfeiting millennia of accumulated botanical and philosophical wisdom. **[Link]:** Preserving heritage is not nostalgic sentimentality, but an active defense of humanity's cognitive wealth.
